I would like to take a moment to tell you a story about something a little more personal to us here at Grant Road Day Care. I want to tell you about the journey Mr. Jayme took for a very special person. I want to tell you this because I think it's important you know how special Mr. Jayme is and what a giving heart he has.

Mr. Jayme's mother, Mrs. Suzie, was a very special lady. This day care has become a family and a 40plus year business because of her heart, her vision of how children should learn and play, her determination and mostly her hard work. It has always been a family business, but she has always been the driving force. Those same qualities are what she instilled in her children and especially Jayme. This is one of the reasons why we are still here today.



The Netterville and Grant Road Family was crushed and devastated by her passing in the spring of 2010. I think it's important that everyone remember her and for those of you who never had the pleasure of meeting her, I think it's important you learn about her.

Mrs. Suzie was such an amazing person. She lived and breathed this daycare. Her smiling face was the first you saw at the door to greet you and the last at the door to say goodnight at the end of the day. She rarely missed a day of work. She helped raise 39 yrs. worth of children who walked through these doors. I was one of them. She protected us, nurtured us, taught us. She loved us.

So, Mr. Jayme decided to give to a charity called Locks of Love. Locks of Love is an organization that, through do-



nations of hair, provides wigs to children who are affected by cancer and alopecia. Mr. Jayme decided to grow out his hair to donate in honor of Mrs. Suzie. Her passion was caring for children so Locks of Love seemed like a perfect organization to give to. I have donated my hair several times and as a woman it was never a hard decision to do so. However for most men it seems to be a difficult decision. Not for Mr. Jayme. He was more than happy to grow his hair ten inches for the cause and even in the middle of the summer. His gesture of thoughtfulness motivated by love was even more important because he was also setting an example. Our Oldest daughter acted on his kindness by also declaring that she wanted to cut her hair off and give it to a girl who needed it. As a wife and mother I couldn't be more proud. The time came about a year or so later. Jayme cut his long and beautiful ponytail. And as a family we donated our hair in honor of Mrs. Suzanne Netterville.

Jayme, I'm so proud of the man that you are. I'm proud to be your wife and that my children have you as their Daddy. You teach them love, dedication and compassion each day. Our daughters have a prince and our son has a hero.



#### **Ingredients**

Cooking Spray

2 lbs. Beef Stew Meat

1/2 Tsp. Kosher Salt

1/2 Tsp. Cracked Black Pepper

**3 Cups** Chopped Onion

1 Tbsp. Cumin Seeds

3 Tbsp. Finely Chopped Jalapeno Pepper

6 Garlic Cloves, Minced

1 Cup Dry Red Wine (don't worry, the alcohol cooks out)

1/4 Cup White Vinegar

2 Tbsp. Chili Powder

2 Tbsp. Dried Oregano

1 (14 1/4 oz.) Can Low-Salt Beef Broth

1 (12oz.) Can Beer (again, the alcohol will cook out)

1/2 Cup Chopped Fresh Cilantro

1/2 Cup Chopped Onion

1/2 Cup Fat-free Sour Cream

## **Preparation**

Heat a large Dutch oven coated with cooking spray over medium-high heat. Sprinkle beef with salt and pepper. Place half of beef in pan; cook 8 minutes or until browned. Remove from pan. Repeat procedure with remaining beef; remove from pan.

Add 3 cups onion to pan; sauté 5 minutes or until browned. Add cumin, jalapeno and garlic; sauté' 1 minute. Add wine, scraping pan to loosen browned bits. If you are uncomfortable with the alcohol in this recipe just omit it and instead use the beef broth in it's place.

Stir in vinegar and next 4 ingredients (vinegar through beer); bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat, and simmer 1 1/2 hours or until beef is tender, stirring occasionally. Stir in cilantro. Serve with onion and sour cream.
